<b>WHAT is happening?</b>		
<p>In accordance with the site Odour Management Plan, Seafield WwTW site operators, Veolia, will be undertaking planned cleaning work in the four storm water tanks shown below. The work has been reviewed through an Odour Risk Assessment process and notified to Scottish Water and regulators. Notwithstanding the forecast weather conditions (see below), the assessment highlights that if this work does not proceed as planned then the risk of odour release from this source during a continued period of onshore winds is increased due to the age of the material currently present in the storm tanks.</p>		
<b>WHY are we telling you?</b>		
<p>As part of our ongoing commitment to minimise any inconvenience associated with the operation of the treatment works, we recognise the need to maintain open communication with our neighbours. The storm water tanks are cleaned approximately 10 times per year and whilst this exercise is routine in nature we are providing this specific update due to the forecast conditions.</p>		
<b>WHEN is this happening?</b>		
<p>Work will commence on Wednesday the 30th May and whilst we shall endeavour to complete this work as soon as possible it may take until Thursday the 31st to complete. We shall inform stakeholders when this activity has been completed.</p>		
<b>WHERE is this happening?</b>		
<p>The four storm water tanks sit centrally within the treatment plant.</p>

<b>WEATHER forecast:</b>
